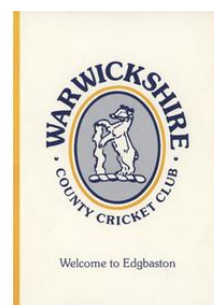

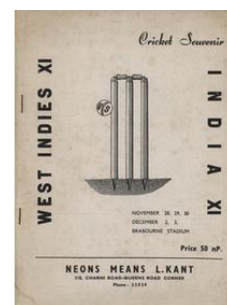

DON BRADMAN 1983 HANDWRITTEN LETTER TO E.W. SWANTON - BODYLINE "DRESSING-ROOM LEAK"



Single-sheet letter dated 12 September 1983 in which the 75-year-old Bradman discusses Swanton's projected biography of Gubby Allen and the recent book on himself by Michael Page in which the author "with my knowledge and support lays the blame squarely on Fingleton for that Adelaide dressing room leak in 1933".
