

MEMOIRS OF SIR HUGH LYON PLAYFAIR ... PROVOST OF ST. ANDREWS



A biographical sketch of Sir Hugh Lyon Playfair, written soon after his death in 1861. It covers briefly his time in the army, serving mainly in India, before focusing on his time as Provost of St Andrews from 1842 onwards. Playfair is credited with instigating many improvements to the town of St Andrews but is perhaps best remembered for his role in reviving The Royal and Ancient Golf Club of St Andrews and, in particular, regenerating the Links. Two pages of the book cover this.



THE RECORDS OF THE PANMURE GOLF CLUB

Panmure Golf Club was established in 1845 at Monifieth, near Barry, Forfarshire. It is said that that Allan Robertson and Alexander Pirie came from St Andrews to examine and lay out the links over nine holes, thus the Monifieth Links were born. It was later extended to 18 holes to form the Medal course in 1880. Henderson was the club's secretary at the time of this book.



Eight small volumes, being the records of matches played at Althorp between 1980 and 1990. All eight involve Earl Spencer's team, with the opposition for 1980 and 1982 being The Master of Christ's XI and for the other matches (1983, 84, 85, 86, 87 and 1990) being Sir John Plumb's XI. Each contains a full scorecard and some brief further details. The 1981 match was abandoned after poor weather. Sir Robert Fellowes captained Earl Spencer's team each time, with other players including Viscount Althorp, Neil McCorquodale and various members of the Buller family.

JUST FONTAINE PRESENTATION WATCH TO FRENCH WORLD CUP TEAM 1958



Commemorative wrist watch, inscribed to dial "*Just Fontaine. World Record 13 goals 1958-1998*", presented to each of the twenty two members of the French 1958 World Cup Squad by Fontaine to commemorate his extraordinary record of scoring 13 goals in a World Cup competition (including 4 against Germany). These were presented after the Final of the 1998 World Cup at the Dinner Banquet. Upon receipt of their watches, each member exchanged with a team mate. Maryan Wisniewski swapped with his room mate Jean Vincent - Wisniewski's World Cup shirt number was '22' and Vincent's '21'. This is number '21', engraved to verso. The details of all Fontaine's thirteen goals are also inscribed to verso. A handwritten letter from Wisniewski (written in French) explains the history of the watch. Maryan Wisniewski played 33 times for France from 1955-63 and passed away in 2022. Just Fontaine passed away in March 2023.

France finished third in the competition beating West Germany 6-3 in the 3/4th play off match. Wisniewski scored two goals in the Finals in Sweden.

The watch and strap are both in good condition, although the mechanism has not been tested.



LE TOUQUET-PARIS-PLAGE HORSE SHOW (SEPTEMBER 9TH 1917 - MUTINY OF ETAPLES) PROGRAMME & TICKET



Original programme and ticket for the Horse Show (Concours Hippique) held in Le Touquet-Paris-Plage on Sunday September 9th, 1917. The competitors were all cavalry officers of the British, Belgium and Portuguese armies. This event took place on the very day of the Mutiny of Etaples, which started when a New Zealand infantryman was discovered returning across the bridge from Le Touquet to Etaples, the neighbouring town, and was imprisoned. This prompted a large mob to congregate near the bridge and as tempers flared a corporal was killed and the mutinous crowd rampaged through the town.

The army base at Etaples was a notoriously harsh environment and resentment of the officers, many of whom were based over the river in Le Touquet, often ran high. Conditions in Etaples were stark compared to Le Touquet, where the officers enjoyed comparative luxury and were free to pursue their own leisure activities, including the show jumping competition on that very afternoon. Gunner Healy, the infantryman who was caught returning from Le Touquet at about 3pm on that Sunday, may well have seen the horse show in passing, and the officers and dignitaries who attended the show would undoubtedly have become aware, as the afternoon progressed, of what was occurring just across the river.

The programme contains a full list of competitors to the centre spread, and an original ticket from the day is attached to the top right corner.

28 x 22cm. Single folded sheet with light folds. There is some paper transference to the back of the ticket where it has been removed from an album.

This is an extremely rare piece of memorabilia from the very day that the Mutiny of Etaples began.
