TWO INNINGS WITHOUT ANY RUNS FROM THE BAT 1878 CRICKET SCORESHEET

In 1878 two cricket teams, within two months of each other, managed to complete their innings without any runs being scored from the bat. On May 18th 1878 Simpkin Marshall & Co. scored a total of 1 (courtesy of a bye) at Holloway against Civil Service Supply Association - and then, on July 11th in a Cheltenham College 2nd XI match, Garth Gammon totalled 7 in their second innings (6 byes and 1 wide) against Christowe. In this match the bowler Cornwall took 7 wickets with successive balls and the opener, Vaughan, carried his bat for 0*. This is an original page taken from the 1878 James Lillywhite's Cricketers' Annual - no great value in itself, but certainly a very amusing and interesting display item.

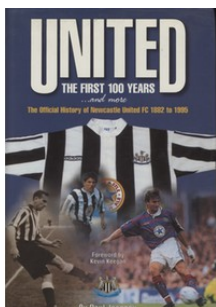

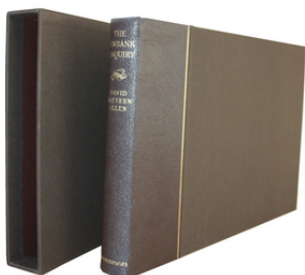

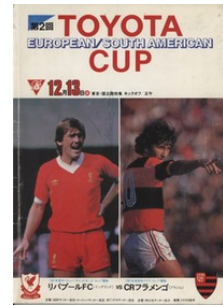

ETON V WINCHESTER & V HARROW 1876 ILLUMINATED SCORECARD (INCLUDING IVO BGLISH, MONTAGUE DRUITT ETC.)



Original illuminated scorecard for the Eton v Winchester match held at Winchester on June 23-24, 1876 and the Eton v Harrow match played at Lord's on July 14-15, 1876. Eton won both matches comfortably.

The Eton teams of 1876 boasted many eminent statesmen and sportsmen, including **Ivo Blish**, the great Ashes winning captain; **Evelyn Ruggles Brise**, the prison reformer and founder of the Borstal System for the treatment of young offenders; and **Gerald Portal**, who was instrumental in the establishment of the Uganda Protectorate (Fort Portal, a town in Western Uganda, is named after him).

Kynaston Studd was the oldest of the three Studd brothers who all went on to captain Cambridge at cricket. He played for Middlesex, carried the flag for Great Britain at the 1908 Olympics and became the Lord Mayor of London. There are also four FA Cup winners in the Eton ranks. **Herbert Whitfield**, **Lindsay Bury**, **Harry Goodhart** and **Charles Foley** all won the cup with the Old Etonians either in 1879 or 1882.

Without doubt the most interesting character who played in these games was Winchester's opening bowler, **Montague Druitt**. In November 1888, for reasons unknown, Druitt was dismissed from his job as a schoolmaster in London. A month later his body was recovered from the river Thames after apparently committing suicide. It was at around this time that the "Jack the Ripper" murders came to an end and many, including the police, began to suspect that Druitt was indeed the Ripper. There is documentary evidence that **Evelyn Ruggles Brise**, as Principal Private Secretary to the Home Office, was heavily involved in the Ripper investigation and was well-informed about the suspicions surrounding his old adversary on the cricket field. After further information came to light in the 1960s many books (and some films) made Druitt the chief suspect, but there has never been any direct evidence to link him to the murders.

LILLYWHITE'S CRICKETERS' COMPANION (FULL SET)



A complete set from 1865 to 1885, 21 editions bound separately. Known as the "Green Lilly", it succeeded Frederick Lillywhite's *Guides*, and contains a wealth of statistical information for the cricket student.

Each bound in green cloth boards with gilt titles to spine. All have their original wrappers (front and back) apart from the 1870 edition (26th) which is bound without wrappers. The wrappers to the 1875 edition are trimmed to edges. One or two of the books are more heavily trimmed to the edges, particularly the 1872, but no text is lost. These books were once part of the collection of Joe Goldman and were sold in the famous sale of his collection in 1966 as lot 143. Each book has his bookplate inside. There is some light staining to some of the boards but the contents are excellent. A superb set of this collectable annual, with a distinguished provenance. [Padwick, 1088]

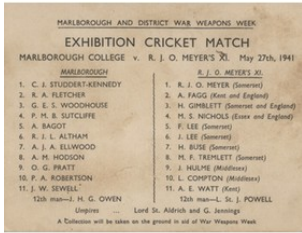

WEST INDIAN ADVENTURE WITH HUTTON'S MCC TEAM 1953-54 (JOHN WOODCOCK'S COPY)
