Official on-site souvenir programme for the World Heavyweight Championship between Mike Tyson and Buster Douglas at the Tokyo Dome, Tokyo, on February 11 1990. In one of the greatest upsets in sporting history, the 42-1 outsider Douglas beat Tyson in a tenth round TKO. Experts said afterwards that Tyson had failed to prepare for the fight properly and that his personal life was in turmoil. While this is undoubtedly true, Douglas fought the fight of his life, keeping Tyson at arms' length with jackhammer jabs. He too was affected by his emotions insofar as his mother had passed away just 23 days prior to the fight.

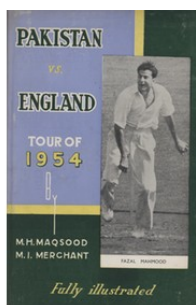

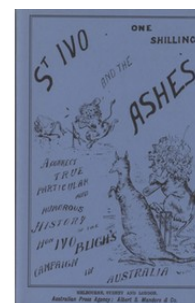

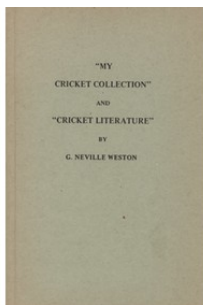

Neville Weston was a significant cricket (and boxing) collector who also wrote a number of limited edition cricket books and bibliographies.

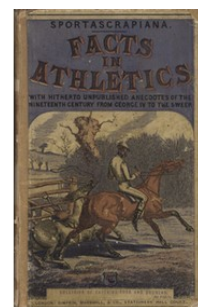

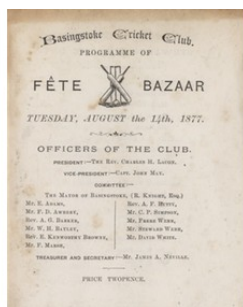

BASINGSTOKE CRICKET CLUB. PROGRAMME OF THE BAZAAR 1877



Programme for the Fete Bazaar held by Basingstoke Cricket Club on August 14th, 1877, including a cricket match between the Club and Mr. Godfray's team. The home team was captained by Captain John May, later Colonel May, and the author of "Cricket in North Hants", published in 1906. He gave the cricket ground to the town in 1880, and it is still called "May's Bounty". The original pavilion was built in 1877 so this bazaar may have been held to raise funds for the new building. Also lists all the stalls, programme of music, stewards for the day and the full teams for the 12-a-side match.

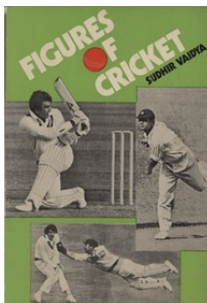

Souvenir brochure celebrating McAvoy's knock-downs, of which there were many. Jock McAvoy (1908-71) was known as the "Rochdale Thunderbolt" having hailed from the Lancashire town and Joseph Tolley's famous boxing stable. In the 1930s he held the British and Commonwealth middleweight titles. Later in his career, he fought and lost several heavyweight bouts against such notables as Freddie Mills and Jack Petersen. From 132 wins, he scored 82 knockouts. He lost 14 times with one draw and was never knocked out in a ring career lasting 18 years. *Ring Magazine* rated him one of their 100 great punchers of all time.



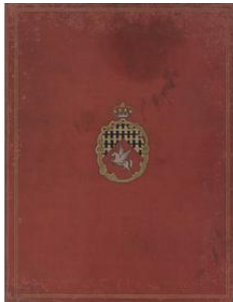
